Jim is looking at his options and has recently sent a letter to the Cardinal to express some of these.

Jim has a number of people from New Mexico praying for him and is very aware of the power of prayer. He is very strong in his faith that the Lord is able to work out all things for the good of those who love Him, and Jim definitely loves the Lord and His Church.

Overall, Jim has been a pleasant presence at the rectory. He has good humor and is very adept at conversing about a wide range of topics. He listens to others and expresses his opinions in a respectful way.

Thank you for the opportunity to share these thoughts. Thank you for all the support you offer me.
