The appointment to Sacred Heart Home has not been announced, has it? I really think we must do something about this. Lou has no public assignment now and it embarrasses him terribly.

While the announcement may help a little, there still is not much work to do. Father Elder continues to be celebrant at the daily Mass. Lou only is expected at the Home one or two days a week. I'm sure he wants to work all day long somewhere, somehow. He also longs to live elsewhere besides home. He is willing for the pastor to know something of his situation.

How about Ascension? he asks. He has picked up a little work in the tribunal but it doesn't amount to much.

This is a very real need for Lou. I had thought that his therapy would absorb his attention but it's only an hour a week with some take-home assignments.
