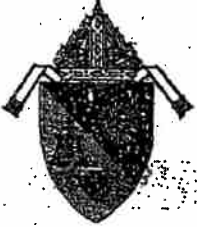

RE: FATHER PAT O'KEEFE AND NICKY RISTER SEXUAL MISCONDUCT INVESTIGATION
I AM NICKY RISTER'S SISTER, CHRISTINE. I HAVE INFORMATION PERTINENT TO THIS
INVESTIGATION INTO SEXUAL MISCONDUCT. I WILL OUTLINE FOR YOU SOME EVENTS
THAT TOOK PLACE FROM 1969 TO PRESENT REGARDING NICKY.

NICKY HAS BEEN SEXUALLY ACTIVE SINCE THE AGE OF 15, IN 1969. HER DATE OF
BIRTH IS JULY 21, 1954. WE ARE 13 MONTHS APART IN AGE AND I HAVE BEEN FULLY
AWARE OF MANY THINGS SHE HAS DONE OVER THE YEARS.

IN REFERENCE TO THE NEWSPAPER ARTICLE IN THE S.B. SUN DATED AUG. 26, 2002 I
WILL CLARIFY SEVERAL THINGS. NICKY AND FATHER PAT DID IN FACT HAVE SEXUAL
RELATIONS. NICKY WAS VERY PROUD OF IT AND STATED SO TO MY SISTER, PAULINE
AND TO ME. SHE STATED SHE ALWAYS WANTED TO "DO A PRIEST". SHE WAS VERY
OUTSPOKEN ABOUT THE FACT THAT SHE INITIATED THE RELATIONSHIP. AT THE TIME
SHE AND FATHER PAT WERE HAVING THIS RELATIONSHIP NICKY WAS 18 YEARS OLD - NOT
17. IT WAS CLEARLY A CONSENSUAL RELATIONSHIP. MY PARENTS AND NICKY MOVED TO
SAN BERNARDINO THE 2ND WEEK OF JUNE, 1971 FROM FLAGSTAFF, AZ. I AM NOT SURE
EXACTLY WHAT SCHOOL NICKY ATTENDED STARTING IN AUGUST OF 1971, BUT SHE WAS IN
FACT LIVING IN SAN BERNARDINO AND ATTENDING SCHOOL THERE. SHE MADE A LOT OF
"NEW FRIENDS" FROM THE VERY START AND EVEN SPENT THANKSGIVING OF 1971 WITH
~~ONE OF THEM INSTEAD OF WITH MY PARENTS. MY PARENTS SPENT THANKSGIVING WITH ME~~

IN LOS ANGELES THAT YEAR AND WE ATE AT THE RESTAURANT AT THE LA AIRPORT
TERMINAL. MY MOTHER, WHO IS DECEASED, DID NOT SUGGEST TO NICKY TO JOIN THE
CHOIR IN ORDER TO GET TO KNOW PEOPLE, NICKY DID THIS ON HER OWN ACCORD (IF
SHE DID IN FACT JOIN THE CHOIR-THIS WAS NOT SOMETHING SHE LIKED TO DO). AS
FAR AS TYPING UP HYMNS, THIS WAS DONE LATER IN 1972 WHEN SHE WAS LOOKING TO
START A RELATIONSHIP WITH FATHER PAT. THIS WAS HER WAY OF GETTING HER FOOT
IN THE DOOR AND HAVING PRIVATE TIME WITH FATHER PAT IN THE EVENINGS IN ORDER
TO PROCEED WITH HER PLANS OF "DOING A PRIEST".

IN MAY OF 1972 I WENT TO MY PARENTS HOUSE FOR A VISIT. DURING THE STAY THERE
BOTH MOM AND DAD TOLD ME HOW UPSET THEY HAD BECOME WITH NICKY AND ALL OF HER
"BOYFRIENDS". SHE WAS BRINGING NEW BOYS INTO THE HOUSE ON A REGULAR BASIS
EVERY 2 OR 3 DAYS. ONE OF THE BOYS MY MOTHER WAS PARTICULARILY UPSET ABOUT
WAS BLACK. NICKY DIDN'T BRING ANY GIRL FRIENDS TO THE HOUSE. MY MOTHER AND
FATHER LED ME TO NICKY'S BEDROOM WHERE MY MOTHER PROCEEDED TO OPEN THE TOP
DRAWER OF NICKY'S DRESSER AND SHOW ME IT CONTAINED ABOUT 30 BOTTLES OF
VARIOUS MEDICATIONS. MY MOTHER BELIEVED THAT NICKY WAS INTO DRUGS. I LOOKED
AT SEVERAL BOTTLES OF THE MEDICATIONS AND FOUND SOME FOR GONORRHEA, STREP
THROAT AND OTHERS THAT I WASN'T REALLY SURE ABOUT, PLUS BIRTH CONTROL PILLS.
I EXPLAINED TO BOTH MOM AND DAD WHAT SOME OF THESE PILLS WERE FOR ESPECIALLY
THE BIRTH CONTROL. NICKY WAS 17 AT THE TIME THIS OCCURRED AND MY PARENTS
ASKED ME HOW SHE COULD OF GOTTEN THESE PRESCRIPTIONS WHEN THEY HAD NOT TAKEN
HER TO THE DOCTOR NOR DID THEY GET THE PRESCRIPTIONS FOR HER. OTHER THAN
HAVING A FAKE ID, I DID NOT KNOW THE ANSWER. I DID EXPLAIN TO MY PARENTS
THAT NICKY WAS IN FACT PROSTITUTING HERSELF OUT BY THE DESCRIPTION THEY HAD
GIVEN ME ABOUT THE MEN COMING AND GOING ALL THE TIME. EVERYTIME NICKY
BROUGHT A MAN OVER THEY WOULD DISAPPEAR INTO THE BEDROOM AND NOT COME OUT TO
WATCH TV OR HAVE ANY CONVERSATIONS WITH MY PARENTS. MOM AND DAD BOTH SAID
THAT THAT EXPLAINED HOW SHE WAS GETTING MONEY. THEY TOLD ME THAT SHE WAS
WORKING AT SOME PLACE (NOT SURE IF IT WAS THE POLICE DEPT. AT THIS TIME OR
SOMEPLACE ELSE. SHE WAS A DISPATCHER FOR THE POLICE DEPT. OF SB SOMETIME
BETWEEN 1972-1973), AND THAT SHE SAID SHE WASN'T MAKING ENOUGH MONEY TO PAY
MY PARENTS RENT ON THE BEDROOM. YET SHE WAS ABLE TO PURCHASE A BRAND NEW VW
(GREEN COLOR) AND WAS ALWAYS WALKING IN THE DOOR WITH NEW STUFFED ANIMALS TO
DECORATE HER ROOM. SHE SAID THAT THESE ANIMALS WERE "GIFTS FROM GUYS". SHE
ALSO WAS CONSTANTLY BUYING NEW CLOTHES THAT MY PARENTS WERE NOT HAPPY ABOUT
BECAUSE THEY WERE TOO REVEALING. SOMETIME BETWEEN MAY AND SEPT. 1972 MY
PARENTS TOLD NICKY TO MOVE OUT OF THE HOUSE.

IN SEPT. 1972 I VISITED MY PARENTS AGAIN AND NICKY WAS NO LONGER LIVING IN THE HOUSE. I WAS VERY SICK AFTER GIVING BIRTH TO MY FIRST CHILD AND MY MOTHER SUGGESTED I GET SOME IRONIZED YEAST AND START TAKING IT BECAUSE I WAS ANEMIC. MY HUSBAND DROVE ME TO A PHARMACY NEAR MY PARENTS HOUSE AND I WENT IN ALONE TO LOCATE THE IRONIZED YEAST WHILE MY HUSBAND REMAINED IN THE CAR. THE PHARMACY WAS SET UP WITH THE PHARMACIST IN THE CENTER ON A RAISED PLATFORM. THE PHARMACIST WENT UP SEVERAL STAIRS INTO THE PHARMACUTICAL SECTION BEHIND CLOSED DOORS. THE TOP OF THIS PLATFORM HAD WINDOWS COMPLETELY SURROUNDING THE AREA SO THAT THE PHARMACIST COULD SEE ALL OF THE STORE. ANYONE LEAVING OFF OR PICKING UP A PRESCRIPTION WOULD BE LOOKING UP TOWARD THE PHARMACIST. EACH SIDE OF THE STORE WAS BLOCKED FROM VIEW OF THE OTHER. WHILE I WAS ON ONE SIDE, I KNEW SOMEONE HAD COME INTO THE STORE AND WAS TALKING TO THE PHARMACIST. I SUDDENLY REALIZED THAT IT WAS NICKY. I WALKED AROUND TO ONE END AND JUST PEEKED AROUND THE CORNER TO SEE NICKY STANDING THERE TALKING TO THIS PHARMACIST. THEY STARTED OUT IN LOW TONES AND THEN NICKY STARTED RAISING HER VOICE TO HIM. SHE SAID THAT SHE WAS PREGNANT WITH HIS CHILD AND THAT SHE NEEDED \$300 TO GET AN ABORTION AND HE HAD BETTER COME UP WITH THE MONEY TODAY. HE ASKED HER TO QUIET DOWN AND HE WOULD TALK TO HER LATER AFTER HE GOT OFF WORK. NICKY GOT LOUDER AND SAID THAT SHE KNEW HIS WIFE'S NAME AND HIS HOME PHONE NUMBER AND THAT SHE WAS SURE THAT HIS WIFE WOULD BE INTERESTED IN KNOWING ABOUT THEIR RELATIONSHIP. THAT IF HE DID NOT COME UP WITH THE MONEY TODAY SHE WAS GOING TO CONTACT HIS WIFE. NICKY THEN LEFT THE STORE. IN ESSENCE NICKY WAS BLACKMAILING THIS MAN. I FOUND OUT LATER IN 1973 THAT SHE HAD DONE THIS TO SEVERAL MEN. THE MEN CAME UP WITH THE MONEY TO SHUT HER UP AND THEN NEVER SAW HER AGAIN. ONE MAN, ROGER DAWSON, TOLD ME THAT SHE HAD TRIED TO DO THIS TO HIM - CLAIM SHE WAS PREGNANT AND GET HIM TO GIVE HER MONEY. HE SAID NO AND TOLD HER TO GO SCREW HERSELF. NICKY PLAYED THIS GAME IN SB, IN FARMINGTON, NM AND IN WOODLAND, CALIF. NICKY ALSO ATTEMPTED TO SEDUCE MY HUSBAND, AND MY OTHER SISTERS' HUSBANDS. THERE ARE ALSO OTHER FRIENDS SHE MADE AND THEN LOST DUE TO HER SEXUAL ACTIVITIES.

I UNDERSTAND THAT NICKY HAS TURNED OVER SOME TYPE OF LETTERS FROM MY DAD TO THE POLICE DEPT. IT WOULD BE ADVISABLE TO VERIFY WITH OTHER FAMILY MEMBERS THAT THOSE LETTERS ARE IN FACT FROM MY FATHER AND NOT FORGED OR FAKE. OF SPECIAL INTEREST PLEASE NOTE THAT NICKY DID NOT TELL ANY OF THE FAMILY MEMBERS THAT SHE WAS FILING THIS REPORT ON FATHER PAT, EXCEPT 1 BROTHER, AND THAT INFORMATION SHE GAVE TO HIM WAS MINIMAL AT BEST. SHE DID NOT WANT THE REST OF US TO KNOW BECAUSE WE ARE VERY AWARE OF HER PAST, OF THE TIMELINES AND HER WAY OF LIFE. YOU CAN GET A BETTER IDEA INTO WHO AND WHAT NICKY IS BY CONTACTING THE BROOMFIELD POLICE DEPT., BROOMFIELD, COLORADO AND THE ADAMS COUNTY POLICE DEPT., BROOMFIELD, COLORADO. THERE ARE APPROXIMATELY 500 PAGES OF POLICE REPORTS THAT THESE TWO AGENCIES HAVE ON NICKY FOR VARIOUS OFFENSES BETWEEN APPROXIMATELY 1990 AND 1996. THERE WERE SO MANY REPORTS THAT THE LAST TIME SHE WENT BEFORE THE JUDGE, THE JUDGE REQUESTED THAT SHE MOVE FROM THE AREA, WHICH OF COURSE SHE DID, ENDING UP IN KREMMLING, CO. NICKY RARELY SPOKE TO MY PARENTS AFTER THEY THREW HER OUT IN 1972. FROM TIME TO TIME SHE WOULD SHOW UP WHEN SHE WANTED SOMETHING - LIKE MONEY. I HAD TO THROW HER OUT OF MY PARENTS HOUSE IN WOODLAND, CALIF. AT MY DAD'S REQUEST. THAT WAS IN 1977-78.

Woman says trust shattered by sexual abuse

Pastor molested her, church
 protected him, she alleges

He told her she was spe-
 cial, that she was the first and
 only one, and what they would
 do would be their little secret.

Nicki Rister was 17 years
 old in 1972 when a trusted
 Catholic priest, Patrick J.
 O'Keefe, took away her in-

 tion with the case, O'Keefe
 last month was charged with
 15 felony counts of oral copu-
 lation with a minor. Rister did
 not disclose the details of her
 sexual contact with O'Keefe,
 who was granted the title
 monsignor in the early 1990s.

 sexually abused her while she
 served as a typist for him at
 St. Adelaide Catholic Church
 in Highland 30 years ago.

"When you are raised such

Cheney: U.S. can't risk inaction

"There are people suggesting that consultations are not necessary because of the technical fact that Congress has been consulted in the past regarding the thrust to the United States represented by Saddam Hussein," Lewis said in a written statement.

It's been too long since a debate regarding Iraq has been held in Congress, he said.

"I have every reason to believe that the president and his people are not only sensitive to this but smart enough to want to have further consultation with members of Congress on questions of such grave import to our country," Lewis said.

The last time Congress formally declared war was more than 50 years ago when the United States entered World War II.

After her mother died, Rister's own father was ordained a priest in the late 1980s.

"You pour all of your heart out to them," she said. "You know that they are one of God's chosen and that you can trust them to the very end of your life."

Rister is yet another purported victim who has come forward publicly with details of sexual abuse in the Diocese of San Bernardino.

Law enforcement officials are barred by law from naming victims of a sexual assault, but the Diocese of San Bernardino says Rister is the woman who reported O'Keefe.

Another priest, the Rev. Paul Shanley, who served in the diocese in the early 1990s, faces trial on felony charges of molesting boys in the Boston Archdiocese.

A Big Bear Lake man, Kevin English, has accused Shanley of sexually abusing him when he was 17 years old. English, now 30, says he met the priest while Shanley was filing in at St. Anne Catholic Church in San Bernardino.

The diocese purchased a plane ticket so Rister could fly to San Bernardino in May to be interviewed by the Rev. Gerald Lopez, who oversees priest personal matters for the diocese.

"They took four weeks to put my interview on paper, and then it was so poorly done that I re-did it in two hours and sent it back," Rister said.

"They allowed Pat to delay doing his interview for weeks for one excuse or another. Then he refused to do it at all and wrote a letter on June 17 and said he was leaving the country for an extended vacation with his brother."

Rister said her interview should have never been shown to O'Keefe and that the diocese should have immediately turned him in to the police before wasting time interviewing him.

She says she called the Sheriff's Department and informed them of her allegations first. Sgt. Jack Trotter said that's true, but that the diocese also reported O'Keefe after she did in April.

"Basic fairness mandates that a priest is informed if an allegation has been made or a police report filed," Lincoln said. "How would you feel if a business you worked for filed a police report about you? Wouldn't you like to know about it?"

Under new guidelines established during a meeting of the nation's Catholic bishops in Dallas this year, O'Keefe is a candidate for laicization, or being defrocked.

Diocesan officials said they have to interview him about the allegations before that process could get under way, Lincoln said.

But Rister said there was a delay, and it gave O'Keefe plenty of time to leave the school he was working at in Laguna Niguel and possibly leave the country to escape prosecution.

"We are fully cooperating with the authorities and are not and have not remotely protected Pat O'Keefe nor have we provided an environment where he could leave or hide," Lincoln said.

"When we found out about the allegations we contacted St. Anne's School in Laguna Niguel and he was placed on administrative leave. The police went to St. Anne's looking for him four weeks ago."

O'Keefe was working as director of religious education at St. Anne, a nondenominational, private elementary and middle school.

Lincoln said the diocese's policy is to report any reasonable, credible allegation of sexual abuse, such as Rister's, to the police immediately.

"We filed the police report before we interviewed her in person in April," Lincoln said. "When she first contacted us in March, we told her to contact the police."

Rister said her experience with O'Keefe and the diocese has turned her off to the Catholic Church.

Also on Monday, the Defense Department announced that it is sending more than 14,000 reserves that they may be required to extend their duty, to

Middle Eastern radio services to broadcast remarks by the third-ranking Pentagon official calling for the Iraqi people to overthrow Saddam.

In Crawford, Texas, an administration spokesman said that White House lawyers have concluded that the administration does not need congressional approval to attack Iraq. The spokesmen, Ari Fleischer, asserted that previous congressional resolutions, as well as the president's power as commander-in-chief, already give him that authority.

Fleischer said that Bush would "consult" with Congress about Iraq, although he pointedly refused to say whether the president would ask Congress to support an invasion through a vote, as his father did prior to the Persian Gulf War of 1991. The White House position that it does not need congressional approval was first reported by The Washington Post and Associated Press.

Republicans said Cheney's speech, planned since early August, was intended to lay out the most serious and complete case for an attack on Iraq.

The speech appeared designed in particular to answer critics who say that the administration lacks intelligence on Iraq's nuclear capabilities.

While Cheney argued that the administration could never know with precision the extent and type of Saddam's programs to develop weapons of mass destruction, he said it would be

Rister said she continues to fight "a big, black wad of shame and guilt" for the things she says O'Keefe did to her.

Authorities issued an arrest warrant for the 67-year-old O'Keefe on July 18. His whereabouts are unknown.

O'Keefe's last known address was in Laguna Niguel. He is a native of Ireland.

Rister said she met O'Keefe shortly after her family moved to San Bernardino from Flagstaff, Ariz.

She spent the last half of her senior year at Aquinas High School and had few friends because she was new, she said.

Her mother suggested she sing in the church choir to get to know people.

Rister does not want to jeopardize the sheriff's investigation of O'Keefe, so she is not discussing the details of the sexual contact.

Rister and San Bernardino diocesan officials agree that the matter was not handled correctly when she first reported the alleged abuse in 1989.

Bishop Philip F. Straling, who headed the diocese from 1978 to 1995, handled the complaint internally but did not report anything to police, said the Rev. Howard Lincoln, spokesman for the diocese.

Straling is now a bishop of the Diocese of Reno, Nev., and could not be reached for comment. Reno officials said Straling is on vacation until after the Labor Day holiday.

Rister said her mother died without knowing about O'Keefe's alleged indiscretions, and she didn't tell her father until 1992 after he was already a priest himself.

"My father turned his back on me and chose the church over me," Rister said. "Pat had been his best friend, and maybe he didn't think Pat would do something like that. That hurt an awful lot, and for years we didn't

Onetime Highland priest accused of sexual crimes

Teen tryst allegations surface after 30 years; arrest warrant i

A Catholic priest has been charged with a
 felony count of oral copulation 30 years ago
 with a then-17-year-old girl who was a parish-
 ioner at St. Adelaide Catholic Church in High-
 land.

An arrest warrant was issued for the Rev.
 Patrick J. O'Keefe, 67, on July 18, along with
 the criminal complaint.

Sheriff's investigators said they don't
 know where O'Keefe is. A native of Ireland,
 his last known address was in Laguna Niguel.

The alleged victim contacted the Florida
 Bishops Conference in April and said she had
 been sexually abused by O'Keefe while he
 was the pastor in Highland, according to the
 Rev. Howard Lincoln, spokesman for the Dio-
 cese of San Bernardino.

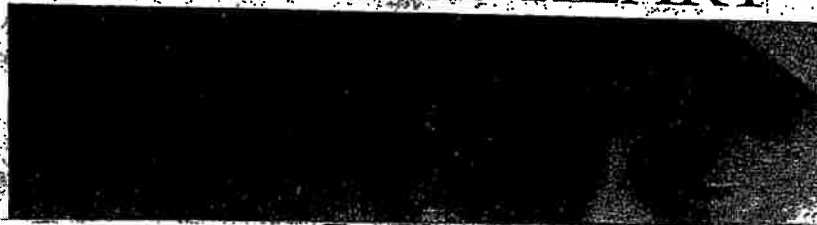
From Florida, the complaint subsequently

was turned over to the San Bernar-
 dino Sheriff's Department.

Sheriff's spokesman Chip Pa-
 rsons said deputies have more than 20
 years to solve the crimes.

"I could tell you that we have

to detail for fear of hurting the integrity of our case."

Investigators are protecting a woman's identity because she is a purported victim of a sexual assault.

Lincoln said the woman apparently reported the incident in 1989 to the administration of former San Bernardino Bishop Phillip F. Straling, but Bishop Gerald Barnes did not learn of her complaint until notified by the bishops' conference in April.

Straling was bishop in San Bernardino from 1978 to 1995.

"In 1989, an attempt was made by the previous administration to address this matter internally," Lincoln said. "That was the way they chose to handle the matter. With Bishop Barnes, it would be handled far differently."

The reported incidents with the teen-age girl is not the first time O'Keefe's sexual habits have come into question.

O'Keefe was fired from the diocese on April 27, 1994, by Straling after sexual indiscretions with three adult women were reported.

Lincoln said he did not know the exact nature of the complaints, the dates or the ages of the women involved.

The diocese settled a complaint with one of the women financially, but a confidentiality agreement issued at that time prevented Lincoln from disclosing how much money was involved.

"The incidents were reported by the women themselves," Lincoln said. "It wasn't rape or anything like that. It wasn't criminal in nature, but any sexual misconduct by a priest is misconduct."

One of these complaints was the last straw. That led to a letter to Father O'Keefe."

In the letter, Straling told O'Keefe that he should seek work outside the church.

"It is not possible for you to continue to work as a priest here in this diocese due to the reasons that you and I spoke of during our meeting," Straling wrote. "It is also not possible for you to go to another diocese."

"The only option would be to seek and obtain a job in the secular world. This should be one that in no way would be associated with duties of the ministry."

Despite the letter, O'Keefe got a job at St. Anne School in Santa Ana in 1997, Lincoln said. The school has students from preschool through eighth grade.

O'Keefe was working there, although it's not known whether it was in a clerical capacity, until April, when the Sheriff's Department began investigating the woman's complaint.

"We informed St. Anne and they immediately dismissed him, and he was forbidden to be around the campus," Lincoln said.

Orange diocesan officials could not be reached for comment late Thursday.

Lincoln said he's not sure if the San Bernardino Diocese told the Diocese of Orange about O'Keefe's alleged indiscretions with the adult women or that he was told he should not seek employment within the church.

"I would think there was a possibility of communication," Lincoln said.

Lincoln said the school got approval from former Orange Bishop Norman McFarland to hire O'Keefe, but he didn't know if McFarland was completely aware of O'Keefe's history.

In April, O'Keefe was made

The Rev. Monsignor Patrick J. O'Keefe, a former priest in the Diocese of San Bernardino, has been charged with 15 counts of oral copulation with a minor.

A native of Kilkenny, Ireland, O'Keefe worked in his parents' publishing business as a young boy and teen-ager. He taught mathematics and religion at St. Kieran's High School from 1958 to 1959. In 1959, he came to the United States after earning a Bachelor of Arts degree in philosophy at St. Kieran's College in Kilkenny.

O'Keefe, now 67, was a priest in the Diocese of San Bernardino from 1969 to 1992. His positions in the Catholic Church include:

aware that he was being investigated on suspicion of engaging in oral copulation with the 17-year-old.

"We do not know where he is now," Lincoln said. "We gave the last address we had for him to the San Bernardino authorities."

O'Keefe was ordained in 1959 for the Diocese of San Diego, of which San Bernardino County was then a part.

He came from Kilkenny, Ireland, where his parents were in the publishing business.

"In those days, they actually went to seminary in Ireland

knowing they would be assigned to places in the United States," Lincoln said.

O'Keefe spent most of his ministry in San Bernardino County, but previously did some work in San Diego County.

"He could be a very eloquent sermonist and a man who had significant experience in ministry," Lincoln said.

"It's a painful subject to talk about, he said.

"Bishop Barnes and our diocese are trying to be very open and accountable and trying to restore the trust that has been lost in the Catholic Church," Lincoln said.

Former students and parishioners did not want to speak on the record about O'Keefe, but they described him as a dynamic, sophisticated man who liked to dress formally and drove a Chrysler New Yorker.

O'Keefe kept St. Bernard dogs at the rectory at St. Adelaide.

Churchgoers described him as a popular priest who had a long line of people waiting for him to hear confession.

He was an adamant public defender of celibacy for the priesthood and pushed that idea as director of vocations for the diocese.

Per your request, please find attached copies of letters I sent to the Bishop, Pat O'Keefe and their letters to me.

As you can see, in his own hand writing he admits "you were the victim" and he "wishes I could love the pain from me" and "wish I could tell you how sorry I am for the past."

I have tried many many times to forget and forgive myself but for some reason it keeps coming back and haunting me. I think it stems from being brought up strict Catholic and the respect that was pounded into us for priests. (It is ironic that my own Dad was ordained a priest after my mother passed away.) All the new stories about others being abused and used just reminds me of what happened and brings back all the guilt and doubt.

Even though Pat says he is sorry for the past, he stresses more how sorry he is that he had to be moved and or transferred. I think he felt worse about that then about our affair. I never heard from Pat after his last letter.

I have sent a copy of this letter and the other letters to the San Bernardino Prosecutor. You had suggested contacting the Child Protective Services but I feel the prosecutor is a better place to start.

I feel it is time to step forward and be counted as one of females taken advantage of by a priest. I have carried this guilt with me for 17 years and just now feel secure and brave enough to tell you about it.

I saw an article on 20/20 about priests taking advantage of kids, and I related to it. I realize these priests are the minority, but that is no reason for us victims to stay in the closet.

I am referring to Father Pat O'Keefe when he was in Highland, Ca. I was only 17, a senior in high school, and very new to the area. The exact dates are very easy to pin down, as I kept a diary of our affair. I am sure you don't want to know all the sordid details, but I can tell you it went on for months. It started Feb. 17, 1972. On April 17, I told Pat (I never called him Father) I thought I was pregnant. He was both scared and excited.

He felt free to call me at home and tell me he loved me, and did so often. My parents thought it was great for me to have such a good rapport with my priest. Little did they know what went on. Luckily, I had, and still have, a girlfriend I could confide in, to help me through all my mixed emotions.

Pat always told my mother that as long as I was a "good" girl, I would inherit all his cut glass from Ireland. My mother and Dad never stopped me from going to the church to "help" Pat when he called for me. They always said to be very "good".

Finally, on April 27th, I found out I wasn't pregnant. I didn't want to continue with Pat, but he continued to pursue me. My love for him made it hard to resist his desires. Eventually, it tapered off.

The lasting effects of this love affair have been much worse than I ever expected. I no longer trust priests and have no desire to return to the church on a regular basis. It has been this way for the 17 years since I was with Pat.

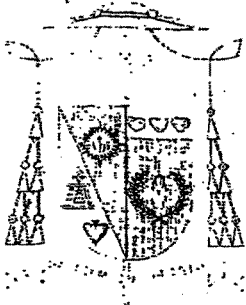

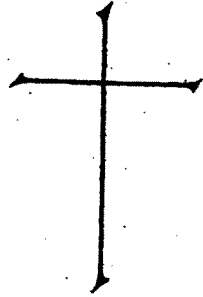

Pat,

Last night I went to church with a friend that is having some problems in her marriage. This was the first time for me in a long time, but it sounded interesting. The name of the Mass was The Praise Mass. It was very interesting. I met a woman there that I talked to for a long time. She was interested in why I felt I couldn't go to Communion. She has had a lot of problems in her life with her father being an alcoholic and was treated very bad. I did not tell her what happened in my past, I just explained to her that I felt that if I received Communion, I felt that a bolt of lightning would strike me dead. She said something very interesting to me after that, she said that I should forgive myself first. My friend agreed. She does know what went on and feels that before I can say I have forgiven you, that I MUST forgive myself. Cherrine, my friend, feels that the relationship between Dad and myself might be improved if I tell him about what happened. I am afraid to tell him, for fear of killing him too because of the trust he had in you. I know Dad is wondering why I did not receive Communion when he married Gordon and I in the church last year.

I never thought about forgiving myself. I never have dug deep enough to realize that I do need to. There is another mass or training session next Sunday on Guilt and we are supposed to bring a picture of ourselves when we were younger. I don't know if I am going or not yet but I would like to. I would love to take my kids to Church on a regular basis. Without guilt. Feeling comfortable about myself. Right now I can't do that. Every time I go in a Church I see you. Everytime I talk to a Priest, I talk to you. I don't have any trust in any Priest. I always wonder who he has hiding in the back room waiting for him like I waited for you. It has been close to 20 years now, you would think that the guilt of our relationship would have gone away, but it hasn't. It still keeps me away from Church. It still keeps me at a distance from my own father. I should hate you for what you have done to me. Using me for your own physical needs and then going on your way, leaving me to cope with the guilt. How many others were there that you haven't had a second thought about? How many others are having to cope with this guilt by themselves? I don't hate you, I feel sorry for you. You are the one who has to face God in the end. You are the one who took advantage of a 17-year old who was lonely and in a new city. This will be with me for a long time still I am sure but I am trying to work it out. I am just lucky that I have an understanding friend to help me, and this other woman who would love to help me if I could confide in her. I don't know her well yet, so that may come in time.

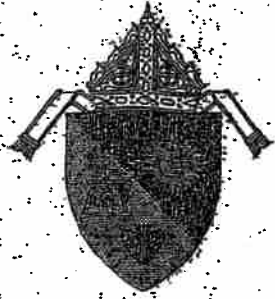

Dear Monsignor O'Keeffe:

At this time, I have received information which appears indicative of the fact that a serious offense against the Church may have been committed by you. On the basis of this information, it appears that you have been accused of sexual misconduct with a minor. This letter serves as a form of citation under the norms of the Code of Canon Law.

Due to the seriousness of this information and by virtue of Canon 1717, I hereby decree that the prior investigation of a penal process be opened and that a cautious investigation be undertaken concerning these allegations and concerning your imputability in order to determine whether it is necessary to take further action.

Under the norms of the Code of Canon Law and the policy of the Diocese of San Bernardino, I hereby designate the Honorable Martin Swanson, Chair of the Diocesan Review Committee, as auditor and hereby direct him to conduct an appropriate investigation into the facts and circumstances of this matter and the related question of your imputability in accord with the norms of law. In addition, Auxiliary Bishop Dennis P. O'Neil is hereby appointed as priest notary under Canon 483.2 of the Code of Canon Law.

I kindly ask that you contact my office in order to present you with the testimony of the person who has lodged the complaint of sexual misconduct. You will be requested to provide a response to the testimony provided to you. Please know that you are in my prayers as this formal process of review begins. Thank you for your total cooperation and assistance.

Dear Monsignor O'Keeffe:

I am writing with respect to my previous communication to you dated May 30, 2002. The purpose of this letter is to amend and clarify the communication of May 30, 2002.

The following points are hereby noted and affirmed in your case:

- 1) According to universal law (cf. Canon 134) and the particular law of the Diocese of San Bernardino (cf. "Diocesan Policy on Sexual Abuse by Clergy"), in my capacity as Vicar General and Moderator of the Curia I have been, am currently, and will continue to serve as the principal and primary investigator of your case.
- 2) Paragraph three of my correspondence of May 30, 2002 therefore shall read "Under the norms of the Code of Canon Law and the policy of the Diocese of San Bernardino, I am hereby designated and delegated to conduct an appropriate investigation into the facts and circumstances of this matter and the related question of your imputability in accord with the norm of law. The remainder of paragraph three stands in effect."
- 3) The role of Judge Martin Swanson and the Diocesan Review Committee is solely to assist and supplement the prior investigation of your case according to the norms of canons 1717 through 1719.

I hope to be able to assist Bishop Barnes very soon in making a final determination on the conclusion of the prior investigation of your case. May the Lord continue to sustain you during this time.

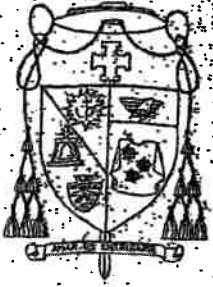

DECREE

On May 30, 2002, a prior investigation of a penal process was opened and undertaken to examine the allegations of sexual abuse of a minor, serious offenses against church law, committed by Reverend Monsignor Patrick Joseph O'Keeffe. After a careful examination of these activities and the question of imputability and on the basis of the proofs which have now been gathered, it is clear that a process for declaring a penalty should be set in motion. It likewise appears that such a process is expedient in light of canon 1341 in view of the fact that it has not been possible to effect a reform of Monsignor O'Keeffe and in view of the scandal and injustice which his actions have caused.

As required by canon 1718, I therefore decree that the prior investigation of this penal process be closed. I also decree on the basis of the proofs that have been gathered that the acts of this prior investigation be forwarded to the Congregation of the Doctrine of the Faith according to the Apostolic Letter *Sacramentorum Sanctitatis Tutela*, Part II, Article XIII.

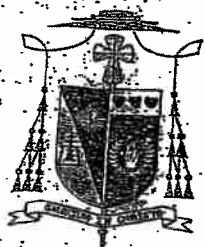

DA Files Charges Against Priest

San Bernardino, CA – The District Attorney's Office has filed 15 counts of felony oral copulation with a minor against Patrick O'Keefe. O'Keefe was a Catholic priest serving in St. Adelaide's parish in San Bernardino in 1972, when the incidents occurred. The victim, a 17-year-old female, was a member of the parish at the time.

Dear Monsignor Pat:

I am pleased that we had the opportunity to speak over the weekend while I was in Hesperia for the Confirmation at Holy Family Parish. I think that some things became clearer to me as to what is possible or not possible. I thought there would be some option from what you said in the past of receiving priestly employment in England or Ireland. I gather that this is not possible because of the same type of problem that we are having here in the states. Other than your being able to return to England or Ireland for vacations or special visits, there is no possibility of full time employment.

It is not possible for you to continue to work as a priest here in this diocese due to the reasons that you and I spoke of during our meeting. It is also not possible for you to go to another diocese because they too would run into the same problems that we have. The only option would be to seek and obtain a job in the secular world. This should be one that in no way would be associated with priestly duties or ministry.

You are entitled to your priest pension benefits once you reach the age of 65. At that time, I would need a letter from you requesting retirement which I would then forward to the Postal Company authorizing payments. At that time, this would amount to \$1,200.00 per month for 30 years of service which you presently have. The question is what do we do between the present time and the official time of your retirement? We

discussed the possibility of a leave of absence or early retirement. You are opposed to the idea of the leave of absence because of some of the connotations that would be attached to it. I have spoken to Monsignor Don Webber regarding granting you early retirement.

The question however is, your means of support as a retired priest until your formal pension would be available. I told you that in this time of transition, as we are doing with other priests who are in similar circumstances as yourself, I will certainly assist you during this time of transition. What I would like to ask you to do is in order to ensure you of adequate funds for this transition, that we would provide you with the current pastors salary and \$600.00 for your rent for the first six months. After that time, we would review with you, your financial condition and then make an arrangement for continuance, change or discontinuance of the stipend. What I envision is your good will in finding adequate employment that would pay your benefits until your pension is available. Once the pension benefits would become available, this could be additional funds to whatever other money you would be earning.

In granting you early retirement, you would not be allowed to do any priestly functions or ministry. I would not see this status from preventing you from saying a private Mass. This may be a little difficult for you to explain to other priests, who know that you are retired, but you would not have faculties to perform public services or ministries.

I am sorry that we must go to this extent of prohibiting your priestly ministry and service in the latter part of your life. However, I think we are both aware of the difficulties and problems that have arisen that make any public ministry or service impossible, at this time. If anything should change


