entered eternal rest on Monday, August 30, 2004. He was born in Boston, Massachusetts,

the son of Nora Donnelly Moynihan and the late George Fredrick Moynihan. He was a graduate of Bishop England High School in Charleston, SC, attended seminary school at St. Mary's in Kentucky and St. Mary's Seminary in Baltimore, Maryland. He was ordained a Catholic Priest on December 7, 1974. Among the parishes he served as a priest in the Diocese of Charleston were Blessed Sacrament Catholic Church in Charleston, St. Paul's Catholic Church in Spartanburg, and St. Thomas in N. Charleston. He served as pastor at St. Louis Catholic Church in Dillon, SC from 1980 to 1989, pastor of St. Cyprians in Georgetown, SC from 1989 to 1990 and became pastor of Our Lady Star of the Sea in March 1990.
