

Rev. Lucien Mandeville

WOONSOCKET, R.I. — The Rev. Lucien Joseph Mandeville, 75, of the Diocese of Portland, Maine, died suddenly Tuesday at his home here.

He was born Aug. 16, 1908, in Woonsocket and prepared for the priesthood at St. Augustine's Seminary, Toronto, Ontario.

Ordained June 15, 1935, by Bishop Joseph E. McCarthy for the Diocese of Portland, he had assignments as an assistant pastor in parishes at Peaks Island, St. Agatha, Augusta, Port Kent, Sanford, Lewiston, Rumford, Waterville, Oquossoc, Dover-Foxcroft and Winslow, Maine.

Father Mandeville was chaplain of St. Ann's Mission, Old Town, Maine, for nine years and chaplain at the Provincial House of Good Shepherd, Saco, Maine for three years.

He was president of the Commodity Service Corp. for the Diocese of Portland from January 1955 to July 23, 1963. He served as pastor of St. Ann Church, Dexter, Maine, four years before becoming pastor of Holy Family Church, Lisbon Falls, Maine, June 8, 1970. He retired Aug. 1, 1973.

Bishop Edward C. O'Leary of the Diocese of Portland was the principal celebrant at the Mass of Christian Burial in St. Ann's in Woonsocket Church this morning. Homilist for the mass was the Rev. Louis Berube of Holy Family Parish, Sanford.
