The Rev. Angus McDonaid will be ordained to the priesthood of the Roman Catholic Church by the Most Rev. Francis D. Gleeson. hishop of Fairbanks, in the Pro-Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception at 5 p.m. today.

The ceremony will write itself into the history of the church here and into the history of the Roman Catholic Church in America.
