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# Father Christian Van Liefde

The Department is saddened to announce the death of long-time LAFD Chaplain, Father Christian Van Liefde.

"Father Chris," as he was fondly known, was unique in that his work with the LAFD was strictly voluntary. He was appointed to the LAFD as Chaplain on October 23, 1980. His last parish as a Pastor was Saint Genevieve Catholic Church, in Panorama City. For decades, Father Chris dedicated his time helping with The Spark of Love Toys for Needy Children program. Many will remember Father Chris stopping at fire stations throughout the city, picking up toys, and delivering them to Toy Central.

Father Chris died on Friday, May 19, 2023, after celebrating with 11 of his classmates his 50-year reunion of being ordained as a Catholic Priest. Father Chris is survived by his 97-year-old mother, Jeanne; his two sisters, Theresa and Nicole; his three brothers, John, Anthony, and Paul; and his eleven nieces and nephews.
