The Rev. David T. Lawlor, O. Praem., a Norbertine priest of Daylesford Abbey, died on December 30 at the age of 74. In addition to the members of his community he is survived by two sisters, S. Frances Lawlor, a Visitation nun, Mrs. Kathleen Mulcahy and several nieces and nephews.

Fr. Lawlor was born in Philadelphia on July 20, 1943. A member of St. Gabriel Parish, he attended Bishop Neumann High School. He entered the Norbertine Order and was vested with the white habit on August 28, 1962 and ordained to the priesthood on April 3, 1971. In addition to several years of teaching at Bishop Neumann High School, he also functioned as a chaplain at Mercy Hospital and served in many parishes in the Harrisburg and Trenton dioceses. He was certified Addictions counselor and spent much of his later years ministering and supporting those in the AA program.

Fr. Lawlor was a devoted apiarist and spent many hours tending the honeybees on the Abbey property and providing honey for the community.

Funeral arrangements are as follows: Reception will be held at Daylesford Abbey on Thursday, January 4th at 9:00 am. Mass of Christian Burial will be held at 10:30 a.m. Interment will follow in the Abbey cemetery. Abbot Antonucci will officiate at the Funeral service.
