Pastor pledges pounds in return for donations

The Rev. Jack Emrich, the new associate pastor at Our Lady of the Greenwood, has issued a challenge

to the congregation.

Emrich, named associate pastor in February after graduating from Sacred Heart School of Theology in Hales Corner, Wis., is an outgoing priest. The kind of priest who greets everyone and who reaches out to give of himself to help his new parish — a lot of himself.

Sunday, he advised the parish that the budget for the new sanctuary, now under construction, is not going to stretch to cover the cost of five stained-glass windows. Clear glass will have to be used until more money is raised.

A big man, at 6-feet, 3-inches, with a big heart, Father Jack has come up with a plan to help out

the parish.

Told by his doctors that he needed to lose some weight after undergoing an angioplasty procedure soon after he arrived at Our Lady, Father Jack is asking the parish for help.

He will lose a pound for every dollar each family donates for the stained-glass windows. He hopes to lose 50 pounds initially and 100 pounds eventually.

"I'm hoping to get 1,000 families to participate," he said.
